...collected research on sexual exploitation of children online available to date in 22 European countries including Russia and in the US.

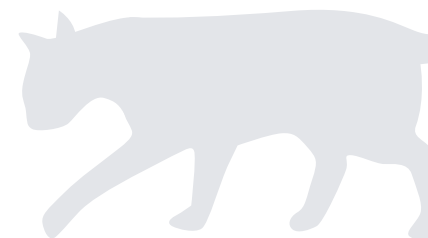
...interviewed young people that have experienced online sexual abuse and online grooming.
