Background

Who? Founded in 1958, COFACE Families Europe is a European network of 50+ family organisations across 26 countries, representing and supporting all types of families without discrimination. What? COFACE Families Europe is hosting an online working group meeting on single parent families: this will include representatives of parents and youth of single parent families, as well as generalist family organisations advocating for single parent families.

When?
